


THE LIFE OF CHARLOTTE BRONTE 1 March 2022

From the first pages of the text, we can distinctly spot Gaskell's artistic infusions of metaphors and the poetic descriptions of the setting.

Upon its publication in 1857, *The Life of Charlotte Brontë* quite predictably caused some controversy as various individuals accused Gaskell of libel and threatened her with legal action. Nevertheless, it is considered one of the most definitive accounts of Charlotte's life and times as well as the works of this Victorian celebrity.
